The *Mahabharata* is one of the two great epics of India that has had a boundless impact on Indian civilization. Over centuries, it has taught customs, values and ethics to the people of India and the world. At 100,000 verses, it is the longest epic poem ever written. Since then, this story has been retold countless times, expanded upon, and retold again and again. Many regional versions of the work developed over time, differing only in minor details, or with verses or subsidiary stories being added. The events of the epic are played out in the Indian sub-continent and surrounding areas. The story of Mahabharata is very popular in south-east Asia. An ancient Javanese version was developed in Indonesia as Kakawin *Bhāratayuddha* in the 11th century. A Persian translation, titled Razmnama, was produced on Akbar's orders by Abul Fazl and Abd al-qadir Badayuni in the 16th century.

The *Mahabharata* was also the theme of later puranas, dramas, poetry and prose, music and dance, as well as the subject of decorations on the walls of temples and palaces.

The present conference is being organised to research the impact of Mahabharta on art, archaeology and the culture of India and the world.

The abstracts should be in English and within 500 words in Times New Roman font, 12 point. It should include the title of the paper, name of the author, institution affiliation, e-mail ID, and keywords text. A short bio-data of the author or authors, not exceeding half typed page, should be sent along with the abstract. The acceptance of the abstracts will be notified by January 15, 2019. The abstracts should be sent to cpriirconference@gmail.com, the official e-mail address of the conference secretariat, on or before the closing date.
